4th MONDAY OUTINGS

25th Mar - 8am

Kawana Forest, Meridan Plains.

This walk is being evaluated as part of the Climate Watch trail. We will start in the Kurrajong park before walking into Kawana Forest. With the open grasslands to the west and wallum sections it should bring a good mix of species. There may be some wet sections so bring enclosed boots if you can.

Meeting Point: Meet at the picnic shed in Kurrajong Park, with parking along and next to Kurrajong Cres, Meridan Plains.

27th May 2017 - 8am

Fairview Walk Wetland Section, End of Porters Ln, Nth Maleny.

The Sunshine Coast Council has done a great job in creating "Fairview Walk". We have now surveyed all three sections with some great results. It will be good to do a repeat survey of the western corner and the wetlands in a different season to observe any changes.

Meeting Point: Meeting point will at the end of Porters Ln. – 400m past Barung Landcare Native Nursery.

Sugarbag Reserve – Caloundra West.

This survey will be in the reserve joining the western side of Ben Bennett. The reserve is now used as a mountain bike park and as such has a lot of paths winding through the reserve. Like Ben Bennett it still contains old-growth eucalypts, with the lower area being a great potential as a frog refuge. It is the shorter southern section that we will look more closely at this time.

Meeting Point: Parking is at the end of Industrial Av. Caloundra West, next to the Council depot & Caloundra Fire Station.

Maroochy Wetlands – Sports Rd, Bli Bli.

The Bli Bli wetlands group have done a great job of upgrading the walkways through the reserve so let's go see if we can find another *Sarmatium*.
