

# Wildlife Corridors Workshop

**Why:** To look at the needs of local wildlife to move, and what we can do to facilitate it

Some animals need to move seasonally, others nomadically (following flowers, fruits, fish, water or other resources), others occasionally if severe drought, fire or other disaster make their home range unliveable. Young animals need to move into new territories. Genetic exchange between populations is needed to prevent in-breeding.

Scenic Rim Regional Council sponsored a survey on squirrel gliders, a couple of years ago and you will hear resultant plans for these delightful creatures, including further surveys, plantings and on-going monitoring.

Other species, from koalas and turtles, to bees and butterflies, even plants (pollen, seeds, spores) also need to move, and these will also be discussed.
