**Berganns Ln, Witta.**

**Lake Baroon – South Baroon Pocket Rd, North Maleny.**

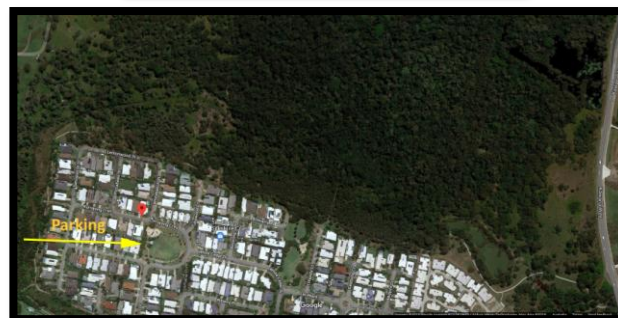
A great walk along the southern side of Lake Baroon. It contains a combination of water birds, and backing up onto a mixture of forest types where last time we saw a population of New Holland Honeyeaters. This should be a good way to end the year with the cool breeze of the lake.

24<sup>th</sup> Feb - 8am  
**Kawana Forest, Meridan Plains.**

This walk is part of the Climate Watch trail. We will start in the Kurrajong park before walking into Kawana Forest. With the open grasslands to the west and wallum sections it provides a good mix of species.
