4th MONDAY OUTINGS

22th Feb – 8am

Lake Baroon - Baroon Pocket Rd, Nth Maleny

A great walk along the southern side of Lake Baroon. It is home to resident and migratory water birds plus a large variety of fauna in a mixture of forest types overlooking the lake.

Meeting Point: Parking is at the end of Baroon Pocket Rd, North Maleny.

22th Mar – 8am

Footo Sanctuary, Buderim.

Named in honour of WW1 soldier and Military Medal recipient Eric Footo this 10ha sanctuary was donated to the people of the Sunshine Coast in 1963. It contains a great mix of soil and vegetation types as the reserve drops down Buderim hill resulting in a variety of fauna and flora.

Meeting Point: Parking is end of Park Ln, Buderim .

26th Apr – 8am

Bobbie Sattler Nat Res, Fred Chaplin Circuit, Bells Creek.

The Sattler name is famous on the coast so it is time to have a quick look at the land that was left by the family.

Meeting Point: Parking is on the North West Corner of Fred Chaplin Circuit.

24th May - 8am

Koala Park, Rosemount.

Panorama Dr, Rosemount.

A great 16ha park on the eastern side of Nabour. We didn't get a koala last time so let's try our luck again!

Meeting Point: In the car park at 123 Panorama Dr, Rosemount.

28th Jun - 8am

Cahills Scrub, Peachester.

This 18 hectare bushland reserve has a great mix of species. Hopefully we will get another look at a Regent Bowerbird in the sun.

Meeting Point: Meeting point is at the of Harold Ln, Peachester.
