Our mission: Advocate, protect and conserve Queensland's native terrestrial and marine plants, animals and landscapes by educating and engaging communities, influencing decision-making, advancing solutions and connecting people and wildlife.

We are seeking people who can contribute to our governance. The society is currently working towards changes in our governance structure to facilitate long-term survival. New councillors must be willing to contribute to robust discussions and activities as we work towards these potential changes. Individual councillors may contribute to one or more sub-committees and proactively identify opportunities and initiatives to promote Wildlife Queensland. It is important that you have the willingness and capability to make a meaningful contribution to the ongoing success of the organisation.

This is an opportunity for you to contribute in a voluntary role and utilise your skills, knowledge, experience and passion with an established well-respected organisation. This is a rewarding position that will value your input to ensure our continued growth and success into the future. Your insight into environmental/wildlife conservation related issues is relevant but not essential.

Our State Council, based in Brisbane, meets monthly on a week day evening, and attendance can be in person (preferable) or via Teams.

Council members are elected, with nominations voted on at the annual general meeting in September. To be eligible for nomination you are required to be a member of the society.
