
# FAUNAWATCH

Named in honour of one of the founding members of Wildlife Queensland this park protects coastal vegetation of wallum heathland, woodlands and dune plant communities that once covered a large area of the Sunshine Coast and forms a last refuge for its fauna.

**Meeting Point:** Parking is at the corner of Coongarra Esplanade and Bareki St.

#### 25th Sep-8am

#### Cahills Scrub, Peachester.

This 18 hectare bushland reserve has a great mix of species. Hopefully we will get another look at a Regent Bowerbird in the sun.

**Meeting Point:** Meeting point is at the of Harold Ln. Peachester

#### 23<sup>th</sup> Oct - 8am

#### Kawana Forest, Meridan Plains.

This walk is part of the Climate Watch trail. We will start in Kurrajong park before walking into Kawana Forest. With the open grasslands to the west, big eucalypts and wallum sections it should bring a good mix of species.

**Meeting Point:** Meet at the picnic shed in Kurrajong Park, with parking along and next to Kurrajong Cres, Meridan Plains

#### South River Park -East.
